#### • Other Incidents

• July 4<sup>th</sup> brought a lot of visitors to Regional Parks, which kept our Rangers busy all day. The alcohol ban was in place on the 4<sup>th</sup>. We had Rangers on motorcycles, patrol units and our boat patrolling Regional Parks. No major incidents were reported. We did increase staffing on weekend prior to the 4<sup>th</sup> and the weekend after the 4<sup>th</sup>. The extra staffing was definitely needed as calls for service kept the rangers busy. We did have some small fires, most likely associated with illegal fireworks, along the American River Parkway. There was a larger fire on July 7<sup>th</sup>, in the Sacramento Bar area along the American River Parkway that burned approximately 30 acres. Sacramento Metro Fire was investigating the cause and origin of that fire.

- Rangers assisted in the death investigation of a body recovered from the Sacramento River by the Discovery Park boat launch. Sacramento Police is the lead agency in this investigation. Rangers assisted in death investigation at William B. pond when kayakers found a body in the river against a tree. He was reported as a missing person out of the City of Rancho Cordova. No obvious signs of foul play.
- Rangers had a very busy Saturday during Eppies' Great Race. The event was sold out with hundreds of visitors present to watch the race. The event ended at noon on Saturday; however, the raft rental companies had one of their busiest days of the year in the afternoon with hundreds of rafts rented. Rangers were busy but there were no major incidents on the day.

We have changed the format for tracking our illegal camping data. We will now be tracking the total number of illegal camps cleared, total number of illegal camping citations, and amount of debris removed from Regional Parks.
